The name was officially given to Mary at the Third Ecumenical Council in Ephesus in 431 AD. The Miraculous Medal is modeled on the apparition of Mary to St. Catherine Labouré in 1830. The first medals were made in 1832. By 1876 (the year of St. Catherine's death) more than one billion medals had been produced and distributed.

This 15 minute presentation is intended to be delivered to small groups (ministries) of our 16 affiliated parishes in order to educate parishioners on the way they can help foster vocations in their parishes.

Our program this day was a tour of Mullen HS. Our host was Mr. Doug Brummel the Pastoral Director. He introduced us to the school program beginning with a short history of St. Jean Baptiste de La Salle and the Brothers of Christian Education Order (aka. Christian Brothers). The school was founded by J.K. Mullen and his wife who modeled what was originally an orphanage after Father Flanagan's Boy's Town (of Omaha, NE). The Christian Brothers were invited up from Santa Fe, NM to administer the orphanage. Mullen High School and all La Sallian schools are part of the largest school system in the world (one million students in 80 different schools throughout the world attend a La Sallian school). Students from 87 different zip codes and 150 different feeder schools attend Mullen High School. The school is independent of the Archdiocese of Denver. The school principal, Sam Govea, greeted us. Mr. Govea attended Christian Brothers schools as a child. He has since spent 41 years in education, all of them in La Sallian schools. Kate Dykstra, Chief Development Officer, accompanied us throughout the tour. She spoke of the ongoing capital campaign and recently completed new construction as well as planned construction. During the tour of the campus facilities, we learned much about the history of the campus and previous buildings that no longer exist. We also received insight into the administration of the school, the educational philosophy of the school, and planned programs and facilities. Mullen High School offers regular "Open House" events and other opportunities to learn more about the school and its educational programs.
