DEACON'S CORNER

November 1, 2024

This All Saints' Day (Solemnity of All Saints) our club attended Mass at Holy Name Church. We held our typical club meeting after mass in the St. Agnes Center at Holy Name. Deacon Don began the meeting by providing us some historical background on All Saints Day. Church celebrations honoring martyrs began in the fourth century. Pope Boniface IV consecrated the Pantheon in Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13, 609AD. He established both All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day.

All Saints' Day was celebrated on May 13 and other days (e.g. Easter Friday or after Pentecost) across various locations. The holy day was eventually established on November 1 by Pope Gregory III in the mid-eighth century. The May 13 celebration was abandoned. The day became a holy day of obligation by decree of Pope Gregory IV. Deacon Don recounted the veneration of a relic of St. Jude that Holy Name Church hosted. 1500 people came to venerate the relic. Because St. Jude is the "Apostle of the Impossible", Deacon Don led us in a prayer while we offered intentions for "impossible" causes. We also acknowledged our recently deceased club members, Tony Jimenez, Paul Bonnstetter, and Norbert Brady with our prayers for them.

Deacon Don started with a few notes regarding the Saint of the Day, St. Albert the Great. St. Albert was a Dominican Priest, a Bishop, a Doctor of the Church, and a mentor to St. Thomas Aquinas. Then we were quizzed on the Works of Mercy.

The Seven Corporal Works of Mercy: Feed the hungry, Give drink to the thirsty, Clothe the naked, Shelter the homeless, Visit the sick, Visit the imprisoned, and Bury the dead.

The Seven Spiritual Works of Mercy: Counsel the doubtful, Instruct the ignorant, Admonish sinners, Comfort the afflicted, Forgive offenses, Bear wrongs patiently, and Pray for the living and the dead.

Deacon Don then turned to history and quizzed us on the dates of various significant events in the history of the Church including those related to the acceptance of Christianity by the Romans and Emperor Constantine, interactions with Islam, the schism between Rome and Constantinople, and St. Junipero Serra's arrival in Mexico.

PROGRAMS

November 1, 2024

Ms. Lynn Reed, OFS Director at Mary's Homes of Hope was our speaker today. Mary's Homes of Hope is located in Arvada, CO and provides a sanctuary of grace and healing for hurting women seeking a haven of peace and love. Ms. Reed was raised by her Catholic grandmother and converted to Catholicism in 1998. She is a member of the Franciscan Third Order for lay people. After joining the Catholic Church, Ms. Reed began going to Planned Parenthood every third Saturday of the month to pray with others for the mothers coming to the facility to get an abortion and for the lives of the unborn. She began to see that the women going into Planned Parenthood for an abortion were more often coming back out without having an abortion. She spoke with the women and found they were broken, unloved, uncared-for people. She gathered friends to develop an alternative to help these women. By the grace of God, someone came forward and bought a house to serve as a maternity home. The purpose of this home was to be a Christ-centered home for these women. After managing maternity homes for 18 years, Catholic Charities took over management of the maternity homes and Mary's Homes of Hope came to be. Ms. Lynn recounted some stories of pregnant women who have lived at their Christcentered home and benefited from the unconditional love they received at the home. She told us abortion counseling is NOT a healthcare choice, but rather an exploitation of unloved desperate women needing help. Mary's Homes of Hope receives no government funding. They rely entirely on divine providence. She noted lots of homeless women are living on the streets or in cars despite having a job and without addictions or mental health issues. After seeing some women return to situations that led them to

problems, Ms. Lynn recognized they needed a permanent Christ-centered home for pregnant women, women with children, and single unattached women. The home had to be a Christ-centered home. She wanted the home to have a chapel. After 15 months, she was offered a house that a couple bought for them and she accepted and eventually obtained permission to have a chapel built on the property. After a recent pilgrimage to Mexico and the Our Lady of Guadalupe shrine, Ms. Reed decided she needed to make her property into a shrine to Our Lady of Guadalupe. Everett Fritz

November 15, 2024

Our speaker this day was Mr. Everett Fritz. His expertise is youth ministry and small group discipleship. He is the author of 4 books, including *The Art of Forming Young Disciples* and *One Disciple at a Time*. Mr. Everett has been working in youth ministry for more than 15 years and founded Andrew Ministries in 2015. His philosophy is to base youth ministry on discipleship small groups. Using this approach, Mr. Everett has seen an 80% increase in students who stayed Catholic in college. Through Andrew Ministries, he is helping youth ministry programs across the country become more effective. He began his presentation with some dire statistics: 79% of young Catholics who leave the Church, do so before their 23rd birthday. In prior years, Catholics comprised 28% of the U.S. population. Today, they are only 25%. Only 19% of Millennials are Catholic and only 14% of Gen Zers are Catholic. A data analyst at FOCUS thinks that at this rate, Catholicism in the United States could collapse around the years 2050-2060. The good news is those young people who are remaining in the Church are passionate about their faith. They are capable and well-formed Catholics. FOCUS and universities are doing better at supporting Catholics. Mr. Fritz attended the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis this summer. He came away from the event (managed by young Catholics) excited by its success and the potential young Catholics have to contribute to the Church. In searching for reasons why young Catholics are leaving the faith, he found lack of catechesis is not the problem because media outlets now provide better access to good information on the faith than ever. Scandals and politics are not the problem. A young person's family may be problematic, but addressing the families that most need the support is difficult. The central issue for young people is they do not know anyone in the Church community and they feel they do not belong. In other words, young people's needs are not being met by the Church. Mr. Everett

reflected on the Church historically pursuing its mission by meeting the needs of people through corporal works of mercy like feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, building hospitals for the sick, and schools for educating the uneducated. Today, most people have these basic needs satisfied, but need personal relationships. He bases his interaction with youth on the concept of discipleship—faithful volunteers leading small groups of youth. He believes Jesus provided his apostles not only the message to spread, but the method for spreading the message by living with them in their small group. Jesus did not go all over the world to spread his message, but rather poured himself into his 12 apostles. Mr. Everett believes youth grow in the faith by following and learning from the example of practicing faithful Catholics. He has found that the only ministries that succeed with young people employ discipleship.
