PROGRAMS

February 7, 2024

Retired Monsignor Tom Fryar joined us this day as our speaker. He was raised in Nebraska and Iowa and came to Denver 51 years ago to attend St. Thomas Seminary. He recounted some of the changes he

has seen in Denver over those 51 years; notably, the role and demise of St. Thomas Seminary and the beginnings of Redemptoris Mater and St. John Vianney Theological Seminaries. Msgr. Fryar pointed out the number of priests in the archdiocese who came to Redemptoris Mater Seminary as missionaries. He told us some of the beauty of going to the seminary is visualizing oneself with the people of a parish as a homilist, as a spiritual director, and as a good priest serving parishioners. You don't see yourself working in an office, but a lot of the time, that is what he ended up doing. He started out as a Vocations Director. He spent 35 of his 47 years as a priest working in an office. He often accompanied the archbishop to perform Confirmations (known colloquially as "being out on the Chrism Trail"). He thinks he has presided over more than 10,000 confirmands. He often advised newly ordained priests to be aware of how the people of their parish can help form one's priesthood. He told us he had lived in 13 different rectories during his 47 years as a priest, so he now encounters many acquaintances from many different parts of the diocese as a retired priest. He has experienced many people who are distressed that their children do not attend church. He recommends praying for our children and grandchildren and said he has observed through RCIA/OCIA classes that many seeking membership in the Church were raised by parents who did not attend church. He suggested we should encourage talking about vocations at home and around the dinner table. It is one thing to talk about vocations at church, but it is another thing to talk about vocations at home with family. Young people should see priests and religious in our homes and communities in addition to at church. Referencing the upcoming Sunday readings, he noted in all three readings, God calls those who consider themselves unworthy. He also gleaned from the readings that God comes to us. We should be open to God in every setting of our lives throughout the day and throughout the week rather than thinking we need to go to church to be with God.
